

Surviving sanctions

- The end of the beginning? The last 2 years have seen an unprecedented number of sanctions. We see courts increasingly grappling with applications from those sanctioned, and from commercial parties whose operations have been affected by sanctions
- We are now moving to a new phase where the pace of new laws has slowed but litigators are called upon to interpret and apply those laws



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Brand Management

- Sanctions, cybersecurity, data privacy, social media and the increasing use of Non-Fungible Tokens (NFTs) all give rise to the need to protect and defend the rights, interests and reputation of clients.
