

War. Ukraine. 2014 - ...



Ukrainian cities fully destroyed by Russian Army:

- ✓ Mariupol (population 622,522)
- ✓ Sievierodonetsk (population 110,612)
- ✓ Maryinka (population 9,256)
- ✓ Bakhmut (population 72,310)
- ✓ Rubizhne (population 55,247)
- ✓ Popasna (population 22,111)
- ✓ Volnovakha (population 20,469)
- ✓ Lyman (population 20,469)
- ✓ Izium (population 45,884)

Demolished and bombed buildings: As of April 2024, there were almost 250,000 damaged buildings direct damage to these facilities is estimated at \$58.9 billion.

Ukraine's reconstruction during the war

 ✓ Energy and critical transportation infrastructures are being rapidly restored (up to 70%)

 ✓ The restoration of vital infrastructure, including kindergartens, schools, and universities, is progressing steadily (up to 35%)

 The rehabilitation of the residential premises is happening at a slower pace, but it is still ongoing

THE LAST THREE MAJOR DISASTERS IN CHILE •

27 f (2010) earthquake:

Statistics:

- Although there is no official number, it is estimated that approximately **525** people died and **56** disappeared.
- 75% of the population was affected.
- 370,000 homes were destroyed or damaged.
- **133** hospitals were damaged, which is equivalent to 71% of the total hospital network.
- 6,168 educational establishments were damaged.
- 211 bridges were destroyed or damaged.
- Over 900 rural and coastal towns and communities were affected.
- The estimated loss for the country was 29,663 billion USD, equivalent to 18% of the 2009 GDP.
- There was an impact on land transportation routes and supply issues.







Santa Olga Fire (2017)

Statistics:

• 11 fatalities.

- Over 500,000 hectares of forests, agricultural land, and residential areas were directly affected. On the first night alone, 396,000 hectares were burned in this area.
- Between 1,000 and 1,200 homes were destroyed.
- It is estimated that among all the aircraft used to combat the fire, a total of 42,839,652 liters of water were dropped.
- The estimated loss for the country was 333 million USD.









Viña and Quilpué fire (2024)

Statistics:

- 31,700 people were affected in Viña del Mar and 7,800 in Quilpué.
- Over **15,000** homes were affected.
- **133** fatalities.









REBUILDING TURKEY AFTER EARTHQUAKE DISASTER

Recovery/delivery models as the framework to undertake the recovery process

- Urban Regeneration
- Social Housing By TOKİ (The Housing Development Administration)

The respective roles of central / local government / private sector / community in the recovery framework

- Collaboration between the central government, local authorities, private sector, and the community
- Challenge between balancing the need for quick aid and the long-term sustainability Establishing disaster centres and micro-intervention groups

INFRASTRUCTURE RESILIENCE AND EMERGENCY RESPONSE CAPABILITY

- Raising awareness of the regulatory aspect in construction works and inspection process for the existing buildings in Turkey
- Assessing the performance of buildings and infrastructure in the affected areas



FUNDING OF THE RECOVERY PROCESS

- Implementation of new taxes and donations contributed by individuals and the private sector
- Low-interest consumer loans to the victims
- Alternative financing mechanisms, including international support from institutions like the EBRD and the World Bank

EFFECTS OF DISASTERS IN TURKEY TO INSURANCE

- Requirement of DASK (compulsory earthquake insurance) policies
- Increase in the construction costs that affect the property insurance market

BUILDING BACK BETTER

- City planning principles, environmental concerns, and feasibility of the housing
- A comprehensive work of legislation underlying the reconstruction and regeneration
 - Transparency in fund allocation











REAL ESTATE REDEVELOPMENT AFTER DISASTER STRIKES

In 2023, the insurance industry covered roughly 40% (US\$ 108 billion) of the economic losses (US\$ 269 billion), indicating a large protection gap:

(source sigma 1/2024)

- The earthquake in Turkey and Syria was the costliest economic loss of the year
- The earthquake in Morocco and the floods in Slovenia were the costliest events ever in these countries and the storms in Italy were the highest-ever insured loss in Italy

Climate change causing increase in frequency and severity of catastrophic events:

(source sigma 1/2024)

- The insured losses surpassed US\$ 100 billion for the fourth year in a row
- Insured losses from natural catastrophes will continue to grow 5% to 7% annually

Importance of having accurate and updated sums insured to include:

- The increase in the cost of materials, components and labour
- Rising costs in the construction sector due to supply chain disruptions
